Guidelines for Using the Index to *North Carolina Libraries*

1. Articles are indexed by title, subject, and first-named author, with cross-references from coauthors.
2. Reviews are indexed by the title and first-named author, with cross-references from reviewers and co-authors.
3. All library organizations are entered under their full names. Information on the substructures of these organizations, such as committees, sections, etc., is listed alphabetically under the organization name, such as **North Carolina Library Association. Round Table on**
4. Some revisions to the quarterly indexes have been made in this annual index so that coverage of the earlier issues of *North Carolina Libraries* is consistent throughout the year.
