

E-book and E-reader Glossary 1-11

Adobe Digital Editions: ADE is e-book reader software from Adobe Systems and uses Adobe Flash. ADE is used for acquiring, managing, and reading e-books and other digital publications. ADE software registered under an individual account may be loaded on up to six machines and allows the user to access/view content on each of them.

Adobe EPUB E-books: Digital versions of print books that have been optimized for on-screen reading. For use on PC or Mac; may be transferred to some portable devices and e-readers. Adobe Flash Player required.

Adobe PDF E-books: Digital books for use on PC or Mac; may be transferred to some portable devices and e-readers. Adobe Flash Player required.


Digital Rights Management: DRM is a way for publishers/creators to authorize the viewing of copyrighted materials on a computer or portable device.

Downloading: The process of loading and saving files from an Internet site onto your own computer or device.

E-book: The electronic counterpart of a printed book, which may be viewed or downloaded in different ways, including on a desktop computer or laptop, e-book reader, or smartphone. In [OverDrive North Carolina Digital Library](#), E-books are available in three formats: Adobe EPUB, Adobe PDF, and Mobipocket.

E-book reader, or E-reader: A hand-held device or software downloaded to a computer or smartphone; allows users to store and read E-book titles. Examples: Amazon Kindle, Sony Reader, Barnes & Noble Nook, Borders Kobo, and many more.

Format: The platform in which a downloadable E-book or E-audiobook file is accessible, such as Adobe EPUB, Adobe PDF, WMA, MP3, etc. Users must check whether their portable device is **compatible** with a particular format. If a device is **incompatible** with a format, the E-book file will not play.

Kindle: E-reader through Amazon that is ~~not~~ currently compatible with OverDrive North Carolina Digital Library. However, free titles from other sources may be downloaded to a Kindle. 

Kobo: E-reader through Borders that is compatible with OverDrive North Carolina Digital Library's EPUB and PDF e-books. Borders Desktop App required to download content and transfer ("sideload") to the Kobo e-reader.

Mobipocket eBooks: Digital books for use on Windows 2000 (or newer), as well as Windows Mobile-based Smartphones and other PDAs. Mobipocket Reader is required; is a free

download. When downloading Mobipocket Reader, must register the reader PID, or Personal Identifier.

Nook: E-readers through Barnes & Noble that are compatible with OverDrive North Carolina Digital Library's EPUB and PDF e-books, and MP3 e-audiobooks.

OverDrive: Library online service allowing participating customers to download E-books, E-audiobooks, music, and video.

Sideload: The process of transferring an e-book file between two devices, such as downloading an e-book file to your computer, connecting your e-book reader to your computer, and transferring (dragging and dropping) the file onto your reader.

Sony Reader: A line of E-readers through Sony that is compatible with OverDrive North Carolina Digital Library's EPUB and PDF e-books, and MP3 e-audiobooks. E-book files would be downloaded to your computer first, then transferred ("sideloaded") to the Sony Reader.
