Sandra Lovely, Chair, called the meeting to order and reviewed the agenda.

Sandra reviewed the last NCLA board minutes from 10/28/22 which she had sent out to all members.. She said that the Conference Planning Committee presented several motions that passed including one to adopt the theme of "Cultivating Community: Strengthening Roots, Supporting New Growth". for the NCLA 65th Biennial Conference. Other motions that passed were to approve the revisions to NMRT Bylaws and to approve a motion from Intellectual Freedom for a Statement on Acceptance and Inclusion in libraries.

Programs/Webinars - NCLA Conference - Since conference planning has started, it was agreed not to do any additional programming but to focus on conference planning. Carrie had suggested several speakers and will follow up with them as a possible author event. Discussion about partnering with other sections was discussed including YSS with a session on book challenges. Other topics mentioned were genealogy and sensory rooms.

Officers - Sandra said that she will be stepping down after providing many years of excellent leadership to PLS. She said that she would like to recruit new talent to PLS and to reach out to other NCLA sections.. PLS usually offers 4-5 programs. Rachel will create a post to recruit new members and a new Marketing Chair. Karen Feeney said that she would serve as chair or vice chair of the Genealogy Committee.

State Report - Since Jeffrey Hamilton was not present, there was not a state report. Jeffrey will be retiring in March.

As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:00 and will meet again in March.
